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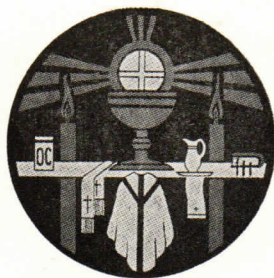

I desire to serve Thee, and to please Thee, to obey Thee and to love Thee always, in union with Mary Immaculate, Mother of God and our Mother, loving also and serving my neighbor for the love of Thee.

Wherefore give me Thy Holy Spirit, to enlighten me, to correct me and guide me in the way of Thy commandments and in all perfection, the while I look for the happiness of heaven, where we shall glorify Thee for ever and ever. Amen.

(500 days once a day. R. #46)

Come, Holy Ghost, fill the hearts of Thy faithful and kindle in them the fire of Thy love.

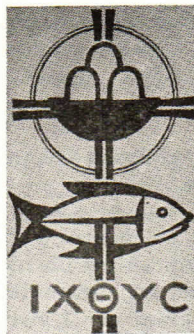
PRAYERS AFTER MEDITATION

Forget their idolatry and unbelief, and grant that they too may some day know Him whom Thou hast sent, even the Lord Jesus Christ, who is our Salvation, our Life and Resurrection, by whom we have been saved and delivered, to whom be glory for endless ages. Amen.

2. PRAYER BEFORE THE CRUCIFIX

Behold, O good and sweetest Jesus, I cast myself upon my knees in Thy sight, and with the most fervent desire of my soul I pray and beseech Thee to impress upon my heart lively sentiments of faith, hope and charity, true repentance for my sins and a most firm purpose of amendment: whilst with deep affection and grief of soul I consider within myself and mentally contemplate Thy five most precious Wounds, having before mine eyes that which David, the prophet, long ago spoke in Thine own person concerning Thee, my Jesus: *They have pierced my hands and my feet; they have numbered all my bones.*

ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

R. Have mercy on our relatives, Lord; * preserve them from eternal death, * and give them the glory of a happy eternity.

R. Vouchsafe, O Lord, * to strengthen and preserve them in Thy holy service.

V. For our living benefactors.

R. May it please Thee, O Lord, to reward with eternal life all those who do good to us for Thy Name's sake. Amen.

V. For all who have commended themselves to our prayers.

R. My God, pour forth Thy blessings and Thy mercies upon all persons and upon all souls in purgatory for whom, by reason of charity, gratitude and friendship, I am bound or desire to pray. Amen

18. ANNIVERSARY OF CORONATION OF THE SOVEREIGN PONTIFF

Those who devoutly assist at any of the religious services held every year, on a day dedicated to the Sovereign Pontiff, either to celebrate solemnly the praises of the Roman Pontiff and to call to mind the countless benefits which he has hitherto bestowed upon the whole world, or to give thanks to God for the preservation of the life of the supreme Ruler of the Church and at the same time to obtain from Almighty God the help he needs in ruling the Church, exposed as she is to so many dangers, may gain:

An indulgence of ten years, if a prayer for the intentions of his Holiness is added;

A plenary indulgence, if in addition they go to confession, receive Holy Communion and pray for the intentions of the Pope

Under thy patronage, dear Mother, and invoking the mystery of thine Immaculate Conception, I desire to pursue my studies and my literary labors: I hereby solemnly declare that I am devoting myself to these studies chiefly to the following end: that I may the better contribute to the glory of God and to the spread of thy veneration among men. I pray thee, therefore, most loving Mother, who art the Seat of Wisdom, to bless my labors in thy loving-kindness. Moreover, I promise with true affection and a willing spirit, as it is right that I should do, to ascribe all the good that shall accrue to me therefrom, wholly to thine intercession for me in God's holy presence. Amen.

(300 days, once a day. R. #763)

A Prayer

The faithful, as often as they raise their mind to God by reciting some invocation in the midst of their duties or work, are granted:

An indulgence of 300 days. (R. #766)

3. MENTAL PRAYER

The faithful who devote at least a quarter of an hour to mental prayer, are granted:

An indulgence of five years;

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, if they do this every day for a month. (R. #688)

4. ACTS OF ADORATION

The faithful who recite some prayer at the sound of the bell for the elevation at Mass, wherever they may be, are granted:

An indulgence of 300 days. (R. #142)

a) The faithful who pay the homage of a due genuflection before the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle, at the same time reciting the following or similar ejaculation:

Jesus, My God, I adore Thee here present in the Sacrament of Thy love! may gain:

An indulgence of 300 days;

b) If they duly genuflect on both knees before the Blessed Sacrament solemnly exposed to the adoration of the faithful, reciting the above-mentioned prayer, or one like it;

An indulgence of 500 days;

c) If they make some outward sign of reverence when passing a church or oratory where the Blessed Sacrament is reserved:

An indulgence of 300 days. (R. #146)

5. FOR THOSE WHO SERVE HOLY MASS

The faithful who devoutly serve a priest who is offering the sacrifice of the Mass, may gain

An indulgence of three years. (R. #674)

6. THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

The faithful, as often as they devoutly sign themselves with the sign of the Cross, with the invocation of the Most Holy Trinity: "*In the Name of the Father,*" etc., are granted

An indulgence of three years.

Whenever they make the same holy sign with blessed water, they may gain:

An indulgence of seven years. (R. #678)

7. ASSISTANCE AT THE EXPLANATION OF THE GOSPEL AND OTHER SACRED DISCOURSES

a) The faithful who devoutly and attentively assist at the explanation of the Gospel on Sundays and the more solemn Feasts, as given during Mass, are granted:

An indulgence of seven years;

A plenary indulgence twice a month, if they are present at such an instruction at least twice a month, as above, and moreover go to confession, receive Holy Communion and pray for the intentions of the Sovereign Pontiff.

b) As often as they hear a sermon attentively and devoutly, they are granted:

An indulgence of five years. (R. #692)

8. CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE

The faithful who devote a half hour but not less than twenty minutes to teaching or studying Christian doctrine, may gain:

An indulgence of three years;

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions twice a month, if the above practice is done at least twice a month. (R. #693)

9. THE READING OF HOLY SCRIPTURE

a) The faithful who spend at least a quarter of an hour in reading Holy Scripture with the reverence due to the Word of God and after the manner of spiritual reading, may gain:

An indulgence of three years.

b) Those, however, who read at least a few verses of the Gospel and further kiss the book of the Gospels, devoutly reciting one of the following invocations: Through the Gospel's words may our sins be blotted out (*Per evangelica dicta deleantur nostra delicta*)—May the reading of the Gospel be our health and protection (*Evangelica lectio sit nobis salus et protectio*)—May Christ, the Son of God, teach us the words of the Holy Gospel (*Verba sancti Evangelii doceat nos Christus, Filius Dei*), are granted:

An indulgence of 500 days;

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, if they perform this act daily for an entire month, as given above;

A plenary indulgence at the hour of death, if they have frequently performed this devout exercise during their lives, provided that they have made their confession and received Holy Communion or are at least contrite, and in-

voke devoutly the most holy Name of Jesus with their lips, if possible, otherwise in their hearts and accept death patiently from the hand of God as the just penalty for sin. (R. #694)

10. KISSING THE RING OF A BISHOP

The faithful who devoutly kiss the ring of a Bishop are granted:

An indulgence of 50 days. (R. #677)
