What can one say about Bishop Breitenbeck or Bishop McKinney except that both are truly men of God. I feel that they are doing their best in all that they do.


In speaking with the seminarians, Bishop Breitenbeck expressed that he feels that what the Church, the people of God, wants today from its priests are men of God - men who know their religion and can pass it on to the present day Church and to future generations of the Church. So Bishop Breitenbeck is sending priests to Rome for intensified seminars in theology. The Bishop is also encouraging his future priests, the seminarians, to take as much theology in their studies toward the priesthood as possible, and to read religious literature for a fuller understanding of today's Church.

Bishop McKinney has accomplished much in the past few years. He has been traveling to different parishes throughout the diocese and, through formal talks, explaining to many people the changes in modern Church. Now he has his own parish in Grand Rapids, doing much of the work that he has always enjoyed and wants to do.

Both bishops are happy about one thing - they feel that they have the support of the priests in the diocese. Bishop Breitenbeck has said that without this support he could not accomplish most of the work that is being done in the diocese. He hopes that he will have this support from future generations of priests so as to further the Kingdom of God.




JERESHMEN.
