

RENOWNED HEALER RETIRES!



Sister Christopher came to the United States after receiving her education as a registered nurse in her homeland, Germany. She wisely chose an internship of one year at St. Elizabeth Hospital in Chicago to improve her English and to learn the American way of life, treatments, and nursing techniques. After passing the R.N. State Board examination, she entered the Marywood novitiate expecting to serve in a community health care facility.

A community health care facility? Yes, at Marywood. But St. Joe's? Fortunately, yes. So in the mid 1930's Sister Chris left the mother house to join the community at St. Joseph Seminary. When asked what was her happiest memory, she replied: "They are all happy memories but I guess the best part was just being mother to those kids."

Reflectively Sister recalls the time when she had some 80 boys down in bed with the flu. That's a heap of sick boys in anybody's books, but "the Fathers would valunteer to help for an hour or two whenever they had the time." "I always had full support of the Fathers in anything I suggested for the boys." From time to time boys were assigned to be assistant infirmarian (one of these was Bishop McKinny). Sister also recalls when the present Bishop Salatka, then a lad with a high fever, begged Sister to "just let me go outside and cool off!"

Although Sister was never able to realize her desire for full time hospital work, she is grateful for the eight summers spent at the hospital in Santa Rosa, New Mexico. Realizing that caring for the needs of many active boys held an element of unpredictable problems, Sister was summoned by the physician there, whenever there was some medical situation which would be particularly helpful to her in her work. "In this way I was able to keep abreast of new things in the field of medicine as well as brush up on bedside care of the patient."

Sister Christopher's many happy memories have been recently highlighted by the blossing and dedication of the Christopher House. Shortly before the ceremony began, Bishop Breitenbeck called Sister to the platform beside him. To her surprise, sort of under her beath, Sister said, "Oh, no". The Bishop replied jokingly, "Obey your Bishop", and then added, "I can't make you a priest, but I can confer this", and handed her the purple sash.

In the program for this occasion we read this note:

In a very special way we dedicate (this house) to the person who gave us our new name, Sister Mary Christopher Steinforth, OP, who has given many years of service.

It is significant that the symbol chosen to represent the Christopher House is the open hand bearing the Christ Gandle, Christ Bearer. Surely Stster Christopher spent thirty-three years of bearing Christ, serving Christ in the many young boys who grew spiritually and physically because of her dedicated years of service.

Our Seminary Family will never forget the joy, love, and understanding that was the life-style of Sister Christopher. She remains in the hearts of every one of us and will be always remembered as truly, A Christ-Bearer.
